


Titles and Speakers (alphabetic order):



1. Reflections on research and the foundational principles of group analysis.

Sigmund Karterud: MD, PhD, is a professor of psychiatry, formerly at Oslo University and Oslo University Hospital. He is a group analyst and author of numerous scientific papers and books on therapeutic communities, group dynamics, group analysis,

personality, personality disorders, self psychology and mentalization-based treatment (MBT). His last book is "Group Analysis. A Modern Synthesis" (Routledge).

Catherina Mela: MD, Neurologist, Group Psychotherapist, Group Analyst, F. IAGP Vice President (2018-2022) and IAGP Fellow Award, Founder and Chair of the IAGP Research Committee (2012-2024), Overseas fellow of the

Royal Society of Medicine, Board member of the International Journal of Psychology and Neurosciences (IJPN), Founding member and f.Director of Education in Group Analysis, of the Hellenic Organization of Psychotherapy and Education in Group Analysis (HOPE in GA).



2. Research in Group Analysis. What works for whom?

Steinar Lorentzen: Professor emeritus in Psychiatry at the University of Oslo, Norway. He is psychoanalyst, group analyst and a founding member of the Institute of Group Analysis, Norway. He has done research in the field of psychotherapy, especially short- and long -term group analysis and has

written two books on this theme: Group Analytic Psychotherapy. Working with affective, anxiety and personality disorders. Routledge, 2014 & Focused Group Analytic Psychotherapy. An integration of clinical experience and research. Routledge, 2022. He is an honorary member of EGATIN and The Group Analytic Society of Lithuania.



4. Meta-Analysis as a tool for evaluating Psychotherapeutic effectiveness.

Marco Tommasi: Born in Verona, Italy. Degree in Psychology from the University of Padua. Ph.D. from the University of Padua. Research fellow (Wissenschaftlicher Mitarbeiter) at Justus Liebig University in Giessen, Germany. Since 2005, researcher first at the University of Cagliari and later at the University of Chieti-Pescara. Since 2021, associate Professor at the University of Chieti-Pescara. Author of numerous scientific

publications and monographs. He teaches psychological testing, research methodology, and statistical analysis techniques in university courses for undergraduate students and Ph.D. candidates. Actual fields of research: intelligence, rationality, personality, psychological well-being, emotion regulation, resilience, psychological assessment.

He studied Social Anthropology at King's College, Cambridge and became a group psychoanalyst at the Institute of Group Analysis in London. In 2001 he published a book entitled How to be a Good Enough GP, Radcliffe Medical Press which outlines and analyses his approach to reform in the National Health Service. Most recently, he co-authored the very successful book Living Leadership, a practical guide for ordinary heroes, published by the Financial Times.
